## Course Introduction

The course aims to develop advanced oral skills in the form of public speaking. Students will be introduced to the principles of effective speech focusing on content, organization, language, delivery, audience motivation and stress management. Students are required to research topics and present speeches in the forms of informative, impromptu and persuasive talks. Class work and assignments include: reading and discussion of assigned materials; viewing and discussion of sample speeches; speech presentations and feedback; and use of visual aids for effective speech.
