Course Introduction

As for spoken Chinese, the course provides a brief introduction of Chinese language, including phonetics, characters, lexicons, and syntax structures, and language practices of conversation. As for written Chinese, the course provides a brief introduction of classical and modern Chinese literature works to discuss some relevant issues about the great development of Chinese expressions in the history.
