Course Introduction	<p>This course is a composite introduction as well as cultivation of speaking, listening, reading, and writing skills in English. The class materials are based on Summit 1, supported by radio programs and handouts prepared by the instructor. Each class session is made up of basic lectures, group discussions, and individual presentations. Students are highly encouraged to participate actively in class discussion and interaction. There are writing and reading assignments each week, which requires students to prepare at home and share their study results with colleague students in class.</p>
