## Course Introduction

This course aims at providing a general overview of the qualitative research methods in terms of project design, data collection, analyses, and writing up. Topics to be covered in the course include four genres: (1) ethnography, (2) phenomenological study, (3) socio-communication study, and (4) case study. The students will have opportunity to (1) read and evaluate published qualitative studies, (2) integrate qualitative research methodologies into their overall research design, and (3) examine the appropriateness of methodologies in doing research in the field of language education.
