Course Introduction

This course is a continuation of Integrated Reading I which introduced students to a range of grammatical, syntactical, and literary elements through the close methodological study of short fiction. It will build on the previous work, encouraging students to engage with a wider range of source materials, including longer fiction, film, and graphic novels. IT will pay particular attention to the development of the students' understanding and critique of style in written form.
