Course Introduction	<p>The purpose of this course is to provide an introduction to the study of culture and human behavior in general, and culture and mental health in particular. The focus will be on social and cultural processes that help students to familiarize the social and cultural processes in mental health-related areas, identify social and cultural processes in their daily lives, and guide students to think critically about the role of culture, race, and ethnicity in human behavior.</p>
