Course Introduction	<p>This course is an 8-month (mid-September to mid-May), project-based course. Students need to integrate all the knowledge and skills from the courses provided by the ELC department and experiences being abroad for a year to design a project to work with a local association. The idea of this course is to reflect the 3 years of learning from ELC, to connect local and global perspectives, to integrate the theory into practice. Students are expected to build up the awareness of social issues and learn to find ways or/and take actions to help solve the problems.</p>
