## Course Introduction

This course is to teach about Japanese economic development. Over the years, there have been three grand strategies in Japan to strengthen the country. During the first grand strategy, the Meiji Restoration tried to attain equality with the Great Powers of Europe and America. The second grand strategy created the second largest economy in the world from postwar reconstruction with the assistance of strong American leadership. The third grand strategy of "bring back a strong Japan" intends to create a third miracle period, following the Empire of Japan and the second largest economy.
