Course Introduction	<p>This course provides an introduction to the basic concepts and methods of formal logic. We will explore the logic of 'not' , 'if' , 'and' , 'or' , 'if and only if' , 'every' , and 'some' . You will learn how to symbolize claims in a way that makes their logical form perspicuous, and you will learn techniques for showing that a given argument is good or bad.</p>
