Course Introduction	This course is a mock exam for Nat’ l Diplomatic Exam; students without ROC citizenship are not recommended to take it. In the former half of the course, the instructor introduces subjects in written test of Diplomatic Exam; students will be asked to take a written mock test based on these subjects. In the latter half, students are required to form groups, take a subject as the topic of presentation, and be asked questions based on their presentation – as does the oral test in a real Diplomatic Exam.
