Course Introduction	<p>This course is designed for the student who speaks other first languages and is learning Chinese as the second language. It is not for students from Hong Kong, Macao, mainland China, Taiwan or Malaysia where Chinese is taught as the first language.</p> <p>This course provides the student with the knowledge and skills to cope with Chinese speaking environment in Chinese speaking communities. It consists of two hours lecture each week.</p>
