<b>Course Introduction</b>	<p>This course provides students with a basis for understanding the functioning of the economic relations between Taiwan and China. Built on these foundations, elective subjects covering the most important aspects of the cross-strait economic relations are offered for students to select as their areas of concentration for more specialized study. Topics discussed include the changes of cross-strait economic relations, Taiwan's investment in China, division of labor between Taiwan and China, the formation of US-China-Taiwan triangular trade relationship, the influence of US-China trade on Taiwan.</p>
