Course Introduction	<p>This course is a mock test for Nat' I Diplomatic Exam; students without ROC citizenship are not recommended to take it.</p> <p>In the former half of the course, the instructor introduces subjects in written test of Diplomatic Exam; students will take a written mock test based on these subjects.</p> <p>In the latter half, students are required to select an assigned date, join a group interview with other test takers, and be asked diplomatic-related questions by the instructor – as does the oral test in a real Diplomatic Exam.</p>
