Course Introduction

This course aims to help students enhance English news reading skills and media literacy. It introduces the basics of English news writing, through close reading and analysis of selective news stories from different categories, such as sports, technology, science, environment, business, and politics. Students will learn vocabularies and expressions often used in news presentation and practice presenting news even in English, both verbally and in written form. In this course, students are encouraged to think critically and independently responding to classroom practices and readings.
