Requirement		<p>大學部日間部學生，須於畢業前完成「社團學習與實作」1學分，課程分為A「入門課程」、B「活動參與」、C「活動執行」三部分皆通過後，計入修課該學期實得學分「1學分」「通過」。</p> <p>修課規定：</p> <p>(一)日間部學生需修習本課程三部份完成後，記錄為「入門課程」修課學期實得1學分。</p> <p>(二)「入門課程」其修課學分數列入當學期選課規定之學分數內；但該學分不列入二分之一不及格學分數計算，且其成績不列入學期平均成績計算。同時該學分數不列入該學期二分之一不及格學分數之計算基數。</p> <p>(三)「活動參與」及「活動執行」，日間部學生於畢業前完成；進學班於入門課程隨班完成。</p> <p>入門課程上課規定：</p> <p>(一)本課程依各系班級分為單週或雙週上課，每次2小時，日間部共上6次課，進學班共上8次課，無故不到者以曠課論，實際上課日期請詳教學計畫表。第1次上課，尚未完成選課手續者，應先暫時在預選班級上課，並取得上課證明（課後請該任課教師簽名），否則該堂視為曠課。</p> <p>(二)學生因病或其他特殊事故不能上課時，須依照本校學生請假規則辦理。學生經核准請假而缺席者為缺課，未經請假或請假未准而缺席者為曠課。缺課及曠課之處理規定如下：</p> <p>1、曠課1小時作缺課2小時論。</p> <p>2、缺課總時數已達該科目全學期所授課程時數三分之一，依本校學則規定辦理。</p> <p>[English version]</p> <p>1. "Introduction" is a series of lessons which are given biweekly (However the actual dates are different in different departments and classes). Every lesson last two hours at a time. Class performance, learning sheets and planning accomplishments are adopted for grading standard.</p> <p>2. Students who gain 1 credit in the semester which complete all the parts of this course. However, this credit is not counted when a student is considered to be expelled by the regulation of failing half credits in one semester.</p>
