Course Introduction

Besides analyzing the EU integration process and path to federalism, we will also explore the main EU institutions: the Council, Commission, Parliament, and Court of Justice. We will also analyze the challenges it faces, including recent Ukraine-related events. Why did the UK vote for Brexit? Has the EU a democratic deficit? Will the EURO resist or it will be substituted? Will Europe develop into a federal (super) state?
