- 1. Students will practice the writing process from brainstorming, to outlining, drafting, and editing/revision; therefore, "see" the development of their ideas.
- 2. Students will be able to develop writing skills through extensive readings and writing of different rhetoric genres (i.e. classification, process, argumentation, cause/effect, problem/solution), thus also understand English text structure.
- 3. Students will understand the importance of an appealing title, introductory paragraph, and concluding paragraph, and practice doing so throughout the semester.
- 4. Students will learn and practice strategies for getting ideas, and to use checklists to self-monitor and proofread their writing.
- 5. Students, as authentic audience for one another, will give constructive feedback and suggestions to each other during the editing and revision phase.
